

Student Voters

Registration: Go to [“Am I Registered Texas”](#) and check if you are registered using your name, county, and birthday.

- Be **18** by Election Day, **November 6** and be at least **17 years & 10 months** when you register.
- Be a **US citizen**, live in **Texas**, and register for the county you live in
- Have no felony or incapacitation records which bar you from voting (off-paper)

You must fill out a [Voter Registration Application](#) and mail it to

You can send a mail-in form to this office even if you are not registering for Travis County. It will be mailed to your county so long as it is in Texas.

This application can be printed out at home or picked up at any public library, tax office, or post office, and many stores. You can also request a postage-paid form to be sent to you from the office of the Texas Secretary of State online. You can register even if you do not have permanent housing. Register until **October 9th**

If you see someone registering people to vote take advantage of it. They'll take care of everything – all you'll need to do is await your voter reg card in the mail!

Voting: Early Voting is **October 22-November 2**. Election Day is **November 6**.

You may vote anywhere in the county you are registered for, though locations may differ from Early Voting period.

If you are not in your county to vote, you may request a **ballot by mail** by printing [this form](#), & mailing it to the appropriate clerk/election administrator listed on webpage.

- Texas driver license issued by the Department of Public Safety (DPS)
- Texas Election Identification Certificate issued by DPS
- Texas personal identification card issued by DPS
- Texas license to carry a handgun issued by DPS
- United States military identification card with the person's photograph
- United States citizenship certificate with the person's photograph
- United States passport

Student ID cards do not count as ID. If you need help, email takeaction@spreadthevote.org for help, including assistance paying fees.

You may ask for assistance with a voting machine or ballot, and you do not have to vote for every position. You may bring a hard copy sheet of who you plan to vote for into the booth, but take no pictures.
